Refreshing Dessert Recipe

- 2 cups low-fat vanilla yogurt
- 3 tablespoons instant, lemon pudding mix
- 8 squares graham crackers, crushed
- 1 can (11 ounces) mandarin orange slices, drained (or your favorite fresh, canned or dried fruit)

Combine vanilla yogurt and pudding mix; gently stir together.

Layer bottom of serving dish with crushed graham crackers, reserving a few tablespoons to sprinkle on top.

Pour pudding mixture over cracker crumbs.

Top with mandarin orange slices or your favorite fruit. Sprinkle with remaining crumbs. Makes 6 servings.

ZUCCHINI CASSEROLE

1 ½ lb hamburger

1-2 small zucchini, sliced ½ inch thick

1-10 ¾ oz can cream of Mushroom soup

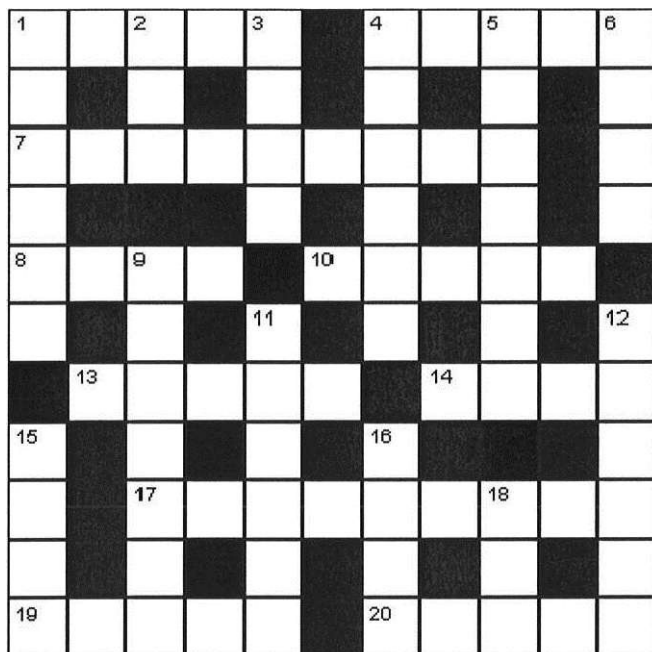
½ lb of sliced or shredded cheese

2 cups bread crumbs

2-3 tbsp. butter, melted

Brown hamburger, drain and place in a 9x12 casserole dish. Place a layer of sliced zucchini on top of hamburger. Spoon soup evenly over zucchini and spread. Put cheese over that. Sprinkle on bread crumbs and pour melted butter over all. Bake at 350 for 30-45 minutes or until bread crumbs have browned. NOTE: you may assemble this one day and bake it the next.
